Outdoor LED Sign

Our outdoor sign has not been working, or working properly, for several years. Many hours were spent on the phone with the offspring of the company, with them tapped directly into our computer, but there is no way for our computers to continue to communicate with the sign. Three bids were secured to replace the existing lighted portion of the sign and REPLACE the top portion as well. At our Congregation meeting on January 26, the Congregation Council recommended a bid from Icon Sign & Design, Inc. for \$16,842.52 to the congregation.

This option replaces the fixed and electronic portions of the sign, allowing more space to be used to communicate our mission and ministry in our neighborhood and on our busy thoroughfare. The congregation also voted to reallocate some dedicated funds in our savings for this project:





\$6,647.00 (Seminarian Support Fund. We currently do not have any seminarians and proceeds from our Endowment Fund can be used as scholarship money to continue to support any seminarians we may have.

\$5,983.65 (Unassigned Dedicated Mission from the sale of the Mission Home).

\$16,842.52 - 6,647.00 - 5,983.65 leaves a remaining balance of **\$4,211.87** still needed for us to go forward with this project. The Endowment Fund has expressed a willingness to contribute as they are able but pressing building needs (including the need for a new roof in the coming years) make them hesitant to contribute at this time.

The Congregation Council thanks you, in advance, for your support of this project. Please clearly mark any contributions as being for the 'Electric Sign' so that they are credited correctly.

Use of Space

The Congregation Council has also begun a study of our use of space with the impending departure this Spring of the Family Growth Center. Their departure will free up a considerable amount of space on our lower level. A task force is being formed that will systematically explore the needs of all our ministry groups at Bethlehem, groups that will continue to meet here (NA, Expecting Parent Organization, community choirs, etc....), as well as the needs of the community and how our building can continue as an *Outpost for God's Mission* and an *Anchor* in our community. If you have input or would like to serve on this task force, please let me know.



Statement of Purpose and Guiding Principles for Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church

God's purpose for our church, as disciples of Jesus Christ, is to share with all people God's word, love and saving grace. We will pursue this purpose by:

- 1. Being a Christ-centered, joyful community of baptized believers who gather regularly for worship, the Lord's Supper, study and prayer.
- 2. Inviting, accepting, and supporting all people as we build attentive, respectful relationships.
- 3. Taking action and risks with bold faith, acknowledging our imperfection, while trusting in Christ.
- 4. Actively engaging in community outreach near and far.
- 5. Being faithful stewards of our time, talents, possessions and all of God's creation.

Adopted January 29, 2017

STEWARDSHIP

Stewardship refers to the act of conducting, supervising, or managing an entity or resource responsibly. Specifically, it is the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care.

The Biblical view of stewardship is managing God's resources for His glory and the improvement of creation. The essence of biblical stewardship is managing everything God brings into the believer's life in a manner that honors God.

There are four principles that relate to stewardship: ownership, responsibility, accountability and reward. In the context of stewardship:

Ownership means God has created it and owns everything, and he has put man here to work as the caretaker of the things he has put in place.

Responsibility means we have been given all we have as a gift from God and are expected to treat each gift with respect and use it to glorify God.

Accountability means we are expected to care for our resources, abilities, and opportunities and use them responsibly, as one day we will be asked to account for our actions concerning these assets.

Reward means that if we do God's will and utilize our gifts to the best our abilities like 'good and faithful' stewards, we will be rewarded in our eternal lives (also a gift from God through faith).

Another way to look at it might be as a fiduciary trust. Everything belongs to God, and we hold it all, manage it all, and direct it all on God's behalf. As a fiduciary, there is an extra burden in that the owner's interest must take priority over the interests of the fiduciary.

In the parable of the talents, Matthew 25:14-30, a master leaving on a journey gives three of his servants money to care for while he is away. Two of the servants manage to grow what he has left them, while a third, fearing failure, buries it to keep it safe. When the master returns, he rewards the first two and condemns the last.

This parable teaches us about using our abilities responsibly. It underlines the value of each person and the importance of developing our talents to help others. It also emphasizes the importance of caring for God's kingdom and the consequences of neglecting his instructions.

An important side to this parable for me is that God gifts each of us differently according to his plans for our lives. He gives each of us what we need in the measures that we need. He does not expect the same thing from everyone, thus the endless variety of Christians serving in endless and amazing ways. He does not leave us floundering without help; He is with us and providing for us as often as we have need.




