# Worship through the Senses

# Incarnation

The Word became flesh and made his home among us. We have seen his glory. glory like that of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John 1:14

Incarnation is typically a word associated with Christmas. Incarnation means embodied in flesh or taking on flesh. It is the conception and the embodiment of God in human. It is the union of divinity with humanity in Jesus Christ. Our 2025 Lent Series, Worship through the Senses, will help us explore what Christ's incarnation means in our Lenten journey as we explore the five senses. Jesus shared our humanity and our embodied experience through these same senses.

These communal gatherings are designed to deepen our spiritual practices and foster a sense of unity among the congregation. Each week, a new sense will be explored, inviting participants to experience their faith in a tangible and profound manner. Through these experiences this Lent we aim to engage with the divine presence in a holistic way. Let us embark on this sensory pilgrimage together, embracing the fullness of our faith in our incarnate Lord through every sense.

## Week 1: Sight - 3/11/25

<u>Luke 19:1-10—As we listen to the account of Jesus' encounter with Zacchaeus, consider the way in which the desire to see and</u> the willingness to see unexpected things play out in this story.

### Week 2: Sound - 3/18/25

Acts 2:1-21—As we listen to the story of the church's first Pentecost, *listen* for the different ways sound communicates God's presence and power and for the ways in which God engages people to join in that communication.

#### Week 3: Scent - 3/25/25

John 12:1-8—As we listen to the story of a gift of love and preparation, notice the description of how the scent of the perfume fills the room. Consider how this sensory description underlays and amplifies the heavy emotions at play in this scene.

#### Week 4: Touch - 4/1/25

Luke 8:42b-48—As we listen to this story, notice how touch can be both oppressive and life-giving. Consider the agency of the different characters in the ways they touch and are touched, and the lessons this can teach us about how we might change how we move through the world.

#### Week 5: Taste - 4/8/25

Luke 22:14-20—As we listen to this story, consider the significance of tasting the same flavors in this shared meal, and how Jesus' words might have complicated the simple act of eating and drinking familiar flavors for his disciples.

Please join us on this journey, Tuesday nights at 7:00 pm, with a potluck preceding at 6:00 pm!

Bread for the World, is a Christian advocacy group, that for 50 years has promoted government programs that diminish hunger in the United States and throughout the world – Bread for the World is initiating a two-year campaign aimed at implementing effective anti-hunger programs, especially aimed at eradicating child hunger in the United States and around the world. Already, several members of Congress from both political parties have given publicly supported to these efforts.

The goals of this two-year effort include expanding the Child Tax Credit; addressing college hunger; fully funding the Special Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), and robustly funding global nutrition.


# CHRISTIAN





## The Season of Epiphany in this Year of Luke




## **Adult Forum – Luke's Story of Jesus:**


