
<u>ASH WEDNESDAY</u> On Wednesday, March 5 at 7:30 p.m. we will have our Ash Wednesday service.

LENTEN WORSHIP THROUGH THE SENSES This series centers on our five senses as a way of exploring the significance of Christ's incarnation throughout our Lenten journey.
